What does innovation mean to the SSH community?



Scholars see innovative means of disseminating their work and data as a chance to improve the process of **sharing ideas with different audiences**, thanks to technological affordances

They understand **innovation** either in terms of **form** (novel means of communicating ideas through different media), or **access** (opening up outputs and making them easily accessible)





What we consider a **"scholarly text"** has thus become understood as an expression that can employ different media and engage creatively with underlying data




